Origin	Canadian Prairies (Saskatchewan, Alberta, Manitoba)
Supply model	Contract-based programs with lot allocation and traceability
Primary uses	Milling and food manufacturing (bread, noodles, general milling and blending programs)

Program overview

- Consistent specifications built for repeat purchasing (not one-off spot loads).
- Lots are cleaned, graded, and packaged near origin to keep freight efficient and documentation consistent.
- Programs can be tightened to buyer-specific targets; COA/testing available on request.
- **Program options:** CWRS (Canada Western Red Spring), CPS (Canada Prairie Spring), and other western classes by request.

Typical contract parameters (set by buyer, confirmed by lot)

Parameter	How it is handled
Class / program	Defined in contract (e.g., CWRS, CPS).
Grade	Defined in contract (No. 1 / No. 2 / No. 3), CGC-aligned.
Protein	Contract target; basis and method defined in contract.
Test weight	Grade-aligned; confirmed by lot.
Moisture	Contract maximum.
Dockage / foreign material	Contract maximum.
Optional (by request)	Falling number, DON/mycotoxin screens, residues, other buyer-required tests.

Packaging & logistics

- **Packaging:** Bulk (program-dependent), 25 kg bags, or 1 MT totes.
- **Terms:** FOB (major Canadian ports), with CIF or DAP options by destination.
- **Lead time:** Scheduled by lot allocation, cleaning capacity, and rail/vessel timing.

Documentation & traceability

- Lot IDs per shipment (traceability).
 - Packing list, bill of lading, commercial invoice.
 - COA / analysis summary and buyer-specific testing (on request).
 - Destination-aligned export documentation pack (as required by contract).
